Course Descriptions - Nurse Assistant Catalog Year: 2012

FUND 0050 Keyboarding Skills - 90 Hours

This course covers an introduction to the QWERTY keyboard, correct finger placement, and keyboarding techniques. Students will learn to touch type as they complete drills and timed writings. Through practicepractice, students will increase their typing speed and accuracy on a computer keyboard.

FUND 0065 Computer Skills - 30 Hours

Students will learn beginner computer skills in a Windows XP environment. Topics include starting a computer, using a mouse, launching programs, creating, saving and printing documents, surfing the World Wide Web and sending email.

FUND 0070 Spelling Skills - 30 Hours

Students will improve their spelling skills by learning and using phonics and common spelling rules.

FUND 0075 Language Skills - 90 Hours

In this course students will practice and improve their language and writing skills and will gain an understanding of the English language and its correct use in written communication. Topics include sentence structure, parts of speech, grammar and punctuation rules in addition to extending these rules to sentences and paragraphs.

FUND 0080 Reading Skills - 90 Hours

This course will provide students with a foundation in reading skills, build vocabulary, and will provide practice recalling and interpreting information.

FUND 0085 Math Skills - 60 Hours

In this course students will learn to perform all four basic math operations accurately with whole numbers, fractions and decimals. Students will also be introduced to percentage and converting between fractions, decimals and percents.

FUND 0090 Study Skills - 30 Hours

Students will learn to use effective study habits and strategies for remembering information found in their textbooks and heard in class lectures. Students will also learn to use a strategy for reading and taking notes from textbooks, in class, and learn effective strategies for taking the five types of tests most frequently given by teachers.

FUND 0091 Davis School District Technical Tutoring - 250 Hours

Technical tutoring provides designated high school students with individual tracking to improve student success in Davis Applied Technology College courses. Students are provided assistance in study skills, test preparation as well as review of student progress and attendance.

NAHA 1004 CPR for the Certified Nurse Assisting - 4 Hours

Students will learn how to perform CPR on an adult, child and infant, including two-person CPR through the Automated External Defibrillator (AED) training. Students will learn how to perform abdominal thrusts and how to contact and use emergency medical services.

NAHA 1009 Nurse Assistant Clinicals A - 15 Hours

Students enrolled in the clinical portion of the Certified Nursing Assistant course will be able to gain experience through the performance of simple nursing skills that are appropriate for the profession (for example, personal hygiene, intake and output, bed making, etc.). Students are required to complete hands-on clinical training at a long-term nursing facility. Training is supervised by state approved clinical instructors.

NAHA 1011 Feeding Aide - 12 Hours

This course is designed for any individual who will be responsible for feeding residents in a long term care facility. This course is designed to meet the federal and state regulations for the paid nutrition assistant. Students will learn federal and state rules and gain practical experience with a competency skills check off.

NAHA 1012 Health Careers for the Nursing Assistant - 15 Hours

This course is designed for students who have an interest in health care professions and will provide an overview of the health care industry. Students will learn about careers that are available, salary ranges, professional organizations, educational preparation, credentials required for different professions, career mobility and employment projections.

NAHA 1014 Certified Nurse Assisting - 70 Hours

Students who complete this course will learn the holistic approach to safely caring for patients in a variety of settings and will develop a basic understanding of how health care systems operate and how to function efficiently within a facility. After completing this course and passing a state examination, students will play an essential role in the health care team by observing, reporting and performing skills learned within this course. Most importantly, students will understand how to work as a health care team member in meeting the patient's needs.

NAHA 1016 Nurse Assisting Clinicals - 25 Hours

Students enrolled in the clinical portion of the Certified Nursing Assistant course will be able to gain experience through the performance of simple nursing skills that are appropriate for the profession (for example, personal hygiene, intake and output, bed making, etc.). Students are required to complete hands-on clinical training at a long-term nursing facility. Training is supervised by state approved clinical instructors.
